

The concept of neglected peoples was first coined by All Nations' Founder Floyd McClung. He felt this term best encapsulated all those towards whom the Father especially leans and holds dear to His heart. For among these, His Son is the least known and worshiped – not for lack of ability, but reachability. They live in the most difficult, and sometimes most dangerous circumstances and places. Neglected peoples, whether the one sheep or the multitude, are considered among the Least because they are marginalized by society and/or circumstances; the Last because they have yet to hear and receive the Good News; and the Lost because the Gospel has had no access, limited access or has been misrepresented. Reaching the neglected requires the creative, many-sided wisdom of God, as well as an undying devotion to see the glory of God fill the earth.

It was upon such apostolic passion that All Nations was founded in 1993 by Floyd McClung. He lived it and inspired others to do the same. His inspiration was motivated by the glory of God and the worship of Jesus in the nations. Today, All Nations has grown into an international Christian missions training and sending organization committed to preparing Christians to share the Gospel and establish churches in parts of the world where the name of Jesus Christ is not known. Hundreds of All Nations fieldworkers, local disciple makers, and churches have been trained, sent, and cared for by Hub leadership. It is the future goal of All Nations to establish ten Hubs in Europe, Asia, the Middle East, East Africa, North Africa, and Latin America to increasingly diversify and support the globalization of fieldworkers in order to reach neglected people groups.
