## **OVERVIEW**



Algeria, Africa's largest nation, was first inhabited by the Berbers, who lived in peace until the 5th century B.C., when foreign influence brought Islamic expansions and French colonial rule. Their fight for independence in 1962 left millions dead, followed by a brutal civil war in the 1990s between military forces and Islamist militants. Their extremist government has made all non-Muslim worship illegal, causing systemic persecution for Christians. Nevertheless, there are an estimated 100,000 believers in Algeria today, despite increasing opposition.

Since 2000, Algerian university graduates, via a lottery, began migrating to the US with their nuclear families. Over 200 come to Olathe, Kansas, every year. This number is expected to increase with the largest Islamic center in the US approved to begin construction nearby. In 2019, All Nations' field workers, the Blacks, began reaching out to Berber believers with home gatherings. Last year they deepened their discipleship and outreach ministry by relocating to Olathe to live among the Algerian community. They have been joined by a Palestinian believer, T. Saada, who shares in their vision to see a church raised up of believers with Muslim backgrounds in the area.
