Since Syria's Civil War that began in 2011, Germany has become one of Europe's main host countries for Syrian refugees. Many fled by boat from Turkey to Greece, then by foot to German Camps, where they undergo an intensive integration process. Unfortunately, the complex needs of traumatized refugees often go unmet, and a high percentage are unable to assimilate well into German society. As a result, many suffer from emotional distress, social isolation and discrimination. In addition, refugees with Muslim backgrounds who become believers are often persecuted by their fellow nationals in the Camps.

All Nations' Hub team in Hamburg began reaching out to the Syrians refugees as soon as they started flooding their city. Hub team member, Salome, a local German mother who speaks Arabic, led our efforts and began home groups to help refugees learn German alongside our team members. Together, they are experiencing a sense of belonging in community, studying, sharing meals, and supporting each other. Another hub team member, Mouyassir, a Syrian refugee who originally met Jesus in route to Germany in 2015, is discipling young believers in Hamburg, as well as in Iraq, Syria and Lebanon via online small groups. In addition, the Heyns family is reaching out to Syrian families in the Arabic speaking community in Hamburg. The All Nations Hamburg Hub hopes to raise up more local Syrian disciples with access to impact the lives of their unreached loved ones back in Syria.

PRAYER POINTS

For the Syrian refugees in Germany to:

- Encounter Jesus and have boldness and perseverance in the face of rejection from fellow Syrians.
- Have a sense of belonging and a community, especially for Muslim-background believers in Hamburg.
- Feel supported in their marriages and families, and for young believers who desire marriage, but don't have their family and community, from their culture, to help facilitate the process.
- Learn the German language, find jobs, and move out of camps into homes.
- Be healed of trauma experienced in Syria and as they fled to Europe.
- Receive comfort in their loneliness from separation with their families back in Syria.

For All Nations Hamburg Hub Team to:

- Deepen and win the trust of the refugees.
- Find more people of peace among the refugees.
- Obtain greater access into the lives of refugees, who are especially busy with the integration process.
- Have wisdom on how to help the refugees more successfully integrate into Germany society.
- Partner with and train German local Christians on how to reach out to the refugees.
